SCIENCE

This term we will be investigating Rocks and Soils. The Big Question' will be:
What is the Earth made from?

GEOGRAPHY, HISTORY and SPANISH

In Geography we will be learning about Volcanoes and Mountain Ranges. Key questions will include: What are the world's most famous mountain ranges and where are they located? How are volcanoes formed? How do volcanoes have an impact on people's lives? What are some of the most famous volcanoes called and where are they? In Music, we will be listening to and appraising songs and singing and performing with instruments.

ENGLISH

We will initially focus on consolidating sentence level skills from Year Two: writing correctly structured sentences, starting with a capital letter and ending with either a full stop, question mark, or exclamation mark, and using commas in lists.

MATHS

This half term our focus will be on place value within one thousand. We will also be exploring addition and subtraction within one thousand. The learning of these skills will involve using mathematical equipment, diagrams and efficient methods.
