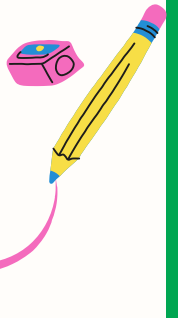

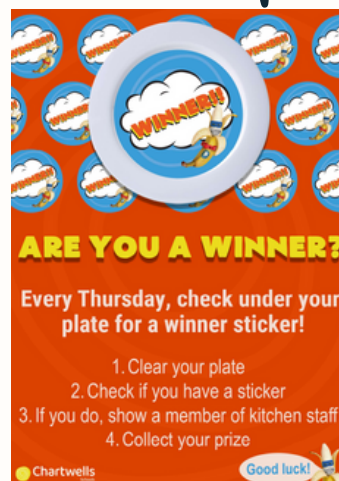

Making a Difference to our Planet

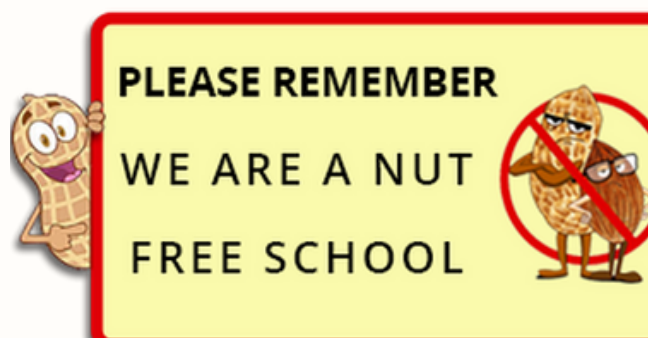

Reminders Sickness

Sadly, we have had quite a few children off poorly already at the start of this term. Evidence shows that children that miss a day in school during the first couple of weeks of a new school year are quite likely to have lower attendance at the end of the year.

As a parent you are the best person to know if your child is well enough to come to school and is able to learn. Should your child wake up with a cough, cold or headache our advice is to give them whatever remedy you would ordinarily use (calpol etc) and send them into school. The only exception would be if your child has a temperature or fever above 38°.

We will always contact you if your child's condition worsens or if we believe it is contagious such as chicken pox, vomiting etc. To prevent spread of infection if your child experiences diarrhoea or vomiting we ask that they do not attend school for 24 hours after the last episode, and if your child suffers with both symptoms then we ask that your child remains at home for 48hrs.

Assembly this week...

This week in assembly, Mrs. Jacobs talked to the children about our values Quality and Expectation - and how the children were certainly living up to this in terms of a fantastic start to the year!

Monday's assembly was about being brave enough to do the right thing, even if nobody is watching (integrity) and even if it's hard. Mrs Jacobs read the book 'Bartolli's Bicycle' by Megan Hoyt which is about a famous Italian cyclist who used his skill and his bike to save Jewish families from a terrible fate in WWII.
